October 23, 2022

- 1. Jesus says that people who make themselves great will be humbled.
- 2. The Church teaching means that humble people do not act proud or brag about themselves. They pray for forgiveness for their sins, and they give thanks to God.
- 3. A virtue is the habit of doing good and wanting to do good.
- 4. The Pharisees of the Bible were a religious group in Jesus' time who shared the same ways of teaching the Law of Moses.
- 5. Saint Katharine Drexel founded the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament for Native Americans and African Americans.

October 30, 2022

- 1. The people couldn't believe Jesus went to eat at the home of a sinner like Zacchaeus.
- 2. Like Zacchaeus, we should work hard to follow Jesus and his teachings.
- 3. Tax collectors in Jesus time were not liked because they often cheated people, and they worked for the Romans.
- 4. Contrition is sincere sorrow for sin and a sincere commitment not to sin again.
- 5. Saint Martin de Porres took care of the older friars and the sick who came to him. He helped poor children and families.

November 6, 2022

- 1. Jesus says that in the second age, people worthy of resurrection will not marry. They will be like angels and cannot die.
- 2. Jesus' Resurrection was his passage from death to life on the third day after his Cruficixion. The Resurrection is a central truth of our faith.
- 3. The Sadducees of Jesus' time were one of the important Jewish groups. They were powerful priests of the Temple, the wealthy elders of landowning families, and the wealthy merchants who traded for goods with other lands.
- 4. Saint Leo became Pope after his predecessor Pope Sixtus died.
- 5. Without an army or weapons, Saint Leo met in person with Attila and convinced the Huns to leave.
